BILL ON CONCURRENCE IN SENATE AMENDMENTS

A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for bail.

On the question,

Will the House concur in Senate amendments?

The SPEAKER. The gentleman, Mr. Armstrong, on the question.

Mr. ARMSTRONG. Mr. Speaker, I am rising in opposition to this constitutional amendment. Our Constitution and the United States Constitution as well as in Pennsylvania calls for bail to be available that is not extreme, and what we are doing here is going beyond the extreme – this is not even offering bail – and we are also assuming that the individual is guilty until they have an opportunity to prove their innocence.

So I find this constitutional amendment tremendously offensive to our Constitution, and I would ask all of you to realize that and also realize that there are many Pennsylvanians across this Commonwealth that are interested in these kinds of issues, and I am sure many of you have heard from them, and if you vote for this, you are going to hear from them.

I am voting "no," Mr. Speaker. Thank you.

A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for bail.

SB 669, PN 1970

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for automatic certification, for definitions, for applicability, for ordinances on lease rental debt, for small borrowing for capital purposes and for management of funds; authorizing school districts to impose an earned income and net profits tax; providing for the levying, assessment and collection of an amusement or admissions tax, a sign tax, a motor vehicle transfer tax and a mercantile tax; providing for the utilization of earned income and net profits tax revenues; authorizing political subdivisions to exclude from taxation a portion of the assessed value of homestead property and farmstead property; providing limitations on exclusions for homestead and farmstead property; establishing a process for administering exclusions for homestead and farmstead property; providing for the rights and privileges of taxpayers with respect to certain taxes levied by political subdivisions; making an appropriation; making a repeal; and making editorial changes.
