

# PREFACE

Although consideration was given to the development of a unified index for the four major subjects of the Convention's concern, it was decided that four separate indexes would prove to be both logical and useful. In the first place, the four areas approved by the electorate for revision, apportionment, the judiciary, local government, and taxation and finance are separate subjects in themselves. Consequently, material pertinent to one index was not necessarily vital to another. Furthermore, the primary value of any index is measured in terms of facility. It is obviously easier to consider one subject at a time in any search of items for analysis. As a result, the four separate indexes will facilitate the research of Convention Delegates by providing logical organization, integration of materials, and practical utility.
